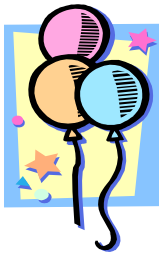

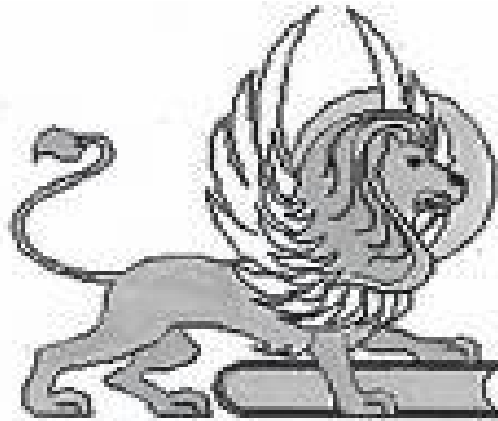
Play Day Looms!!!
